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Don't forget; it is your responsibility to prepare your site prior to our arrival & obtain the proper permits

SHED MOVE REQUIREMENTS

The Barn Raiser will move an existing **Amish-built** shed either on your property or from one location to another. If you are not the property owner at either the pick up or drop off location, we will require the property owner to sign this form allowing us on their property for removal of the shed. We will be using a heavy duty pick-up truck and an 8500 LB steel 24' long shed trailer to do the move. We do NOT use a forklift / mule or any other equipment. **WE MUST HAVE ACCESS TO BACK-IN TO BOTH LOCATIONS. We need space that is reasonably wider than the width of the shed that we are moving.** There should be no obstacles in our way at ground level and also up to 13'6" high along the access path for pick up/drop off. The shed should not be situated right up against another structure.

When a shed/barn is **Amish-built**, it should meet certain width, height, and specification criteria to allow us to meet DOT regulations for safe and legal road travel. We strap it down using the pressure-treated runners. **Home-built sheds are not constructed for highway travel.**

We require digital photos of the building and the access to the building (taken from the road) at both locations. We will need to know the total width at the sheds widest point (roof eave to roof eave) and total height at the sheds highest point. The shed should be empty at the time of the move. Anything left inside will tumble over when the shed is tilted for pick up. The Barn Raiser is not responsible for damage to anything left inside the shed.

We need clear access to the shed and around the shed at the time of the move. If you want any kind of animal shelter moved, like a floorless horse barn, the area in and around it needs to be **CLEANED** of animal feces/muck so we can jack it up and load it without issue. Any building we move must be in reasonably good condition and sound for travel. No rotting or deteriorating floors, walls, roofs. If we pick up an old building and it falls apart in any way...you will still owe us the entire move fee for our time.

- WE DO NOT MOVE HOME-BUILT SHEDS or LOWES & HOME DEPOT SHEDS.**
- WE DO NOT MOVE SHEDS TALLER THAN 11' HIGH FROM GROUND TO PEAK.**
- WE DO NOT MOVE SHEDS WIDER THAN 13'11" MEASURED AT THE WIDEST POINT - ROOF EAVE TO ROOF EAVE. All sheds over 12' wide at the roof require an escort and additional fees.**
- WE WILL NOT PICK UP OR PLACE THE SHED ON A RAISED PLATFORM OR CINDER BLOCKS.**
- WE DO NOT OFFER FREE SITE CHECKS FOR SHED MOVES. We will consider looking for a fee.**
- WE DO NOT ACCEPT CREDIT CARDS FOR SHED MOVES. PAYMENT DUE UPON PICK UP.**

Important: While we are always professional and try to be as careful as possible; The Barn Raiser or its crew cannot be held responsible for any damage to the shed or for the properties we traverse with the shed. This includes landscaping, bushes, pavers, asphalt driveways, etc. We are coming onto your property at your request. We must rely on you to tell us if it is dry & firm enough to perform the service and we must rely on you to make sure we have a clear path in and out. The truck and trailer, and the building on the trailer, makes the entire set up VERY heavy and we **will** cause tire ruts on soft surfaces. Having a prepared level gravel pad for the shed to rest upon is always best.
